



Syrian refugees continue to face heightened risks due to unequal access to primarily shelter and other humanitarian services.11



Syrian refugees are more likely to be evicted, live in substandard housing, or are homeless. 12



Some Syrian refugee families are forced to return to unsafe areas due to the lack of shelter and livelihood alternatives.13
